Stay Safe Policy

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March 2019

Pelletstown Educate Together National School teaches the **Stay Safe Programme**, a teaching package designed for use in Irish primary schools. It was researched and developed by the Child Abuse Prevention Programme. The aim of the programme is to prevent both physical and sexual abuse of children.

Under Child Protection Guidelines all schools are obliged to teach the Stay Safe programme. The Stay Safe Programme has been updated and from the 2018-2019 school year onwards, the revised Stay Safe Programme will be implemented in its totality in each class in the school.

Stay Safe is taught as part of the SPHE (Social Personal and Health Education) curriculum and this overview plan should be read in conjunction with the SPHE policy of Pelletstown Educate Together National School. As per best practice recommendations it will be covered as follows: The Stay Safe programme will be taught in entirety in Junior Infants, 1st class, 3rd class and 5th class. Mini lessons will take place in all other years. (Appendix 1: Stay Safe Vocabulary). Children from Junior Infants to Sixth Class participate in formal lessons on the Stay Safe Programme.

Parents/carers are encouraged to become involved by discussing each lesson with their child and helping their child to complete each worksheet based on the lessons in the programme.

Parents are informed in advance of commencement of teaching the Stay Safe Programme. They are directed to www.pdst.ie/staysafe to see the content of the lessons and for any further information they might need. They may also meet with their child's class teacher to review the material being taught.

In the event that a parent informs the school that they wish to withdraw their child from the Stay Safe Programme, a written record of their reasons for doing is required from the parent. This is retained on the child's school file.

CPD training on the revised Stay Safe programme was provided for all teaching staff in August 2018, when a PDST facilitator hosted a workshop in this regard.

Implementation

a. Roles and Responsibilities

The Principal, Deputy Principal and APII (overseen by the BOM) are responsible for overseeing and supporting the implementation of the Stay Safe aspect of the S.P.H.E. Programme.

Class teachers are responsible for the implementation of Stay Safe Programme in their classes, including the distribution of relevant information and notes to parents/carers.

b. Timeframe

This whole-school policy will be implemented from 2018-2019 school year.

Review

Prior to the launch of this Stay Safe policy, a draft policy was reviewed by staff members and by the Parent Teacher Association.

This policy will be reviewed during the 2022-2023 school year, when we have completed a full school cycle of Junior Infants - Sixth Class.

The policy will be reviewed before then, should a need arise.

Ratification and Communication

The attention of all newly appointed staff will be drawn to this whole-school plan upon their appointment to the school by the NQT mentor.

This policy will be published on the school website, and a copy of it will be provided to the Parent Teacher Association. A copy of this policy will be made available to the Department of Education and Skills and the Patron, if requested. Hard copies of this, and all school policies, are available at the school upon request.

This policy was adopted by the Board of Management on 28th March 2019.
