
Senior Infants - Spideog

Our senior classes had a busy term with lots of athletics events. 3rd-6th class students took part in a Cross Country event in Ringsend Park and lots of students came back with silverware!


Santry Sports took place at the end of May and students represented PETNS proudly in track running events and shot putt. Well done to everyone involved!

Lots of classes throughout the school planted potatoes, peas, beans, strawberries, and onions this year. Most were started in the classroom and then planted in the school vegetable garden. Some classes have started harvesting and eating their produce and Garden Gang celebrated their growing season with a feast! To support biodiversity we planted native wildflower seeds and left some grass areas to grow wild. We planted some native







frogspawn grow into froglets and kept a close eye on some blackbird's nesting. Our hard work was recognised in achieving a Bronze Badger Nature Hero Award for supporting biodiversity.



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On Thursday 19th June we were delighted to welcome local Irish Olympic medallist Eimear Lambe to the school for our senior sports assembly. Eimear won a bronze medal in the 2020 Olympic in Tokyo for rowing. She spoke to the children about her Olympic experience and answered questions from the student council all about her training schedule and healthy eating. Eimear also told the children that she didn't take up rowing until she was 12, and that it was the first sport she really enjoyed! She spoke about the importance of perseverance and trying your best! 


Different Families Same Love
